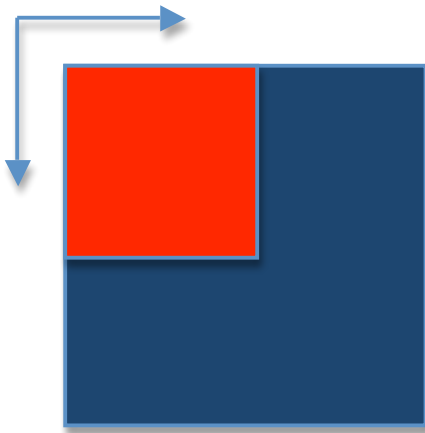


## Lecture 4: Layout Design and Production

Fill in the CSS code to achieve the desired positioning of the blocks. Assume the widths, heights, and background-colors are already properly set.

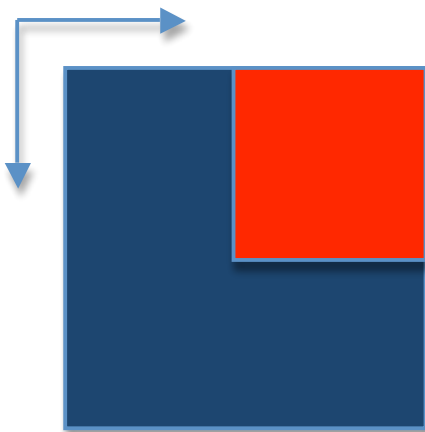
HTML for 2 box examples: `<div id="blue"><div id="red"></div></div>`

HTML for 3 box examples: `<div id="blue"><div id="red"><div id="green"></div></div></div>`



\*default positioning, although you can also position it manually as well

```



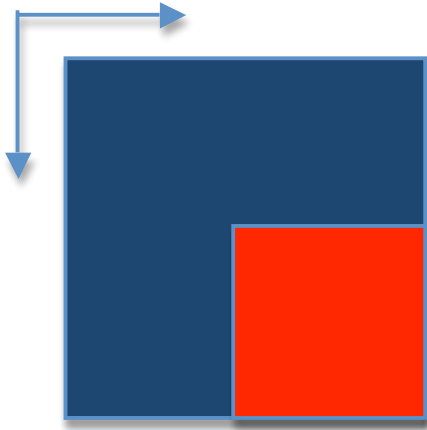

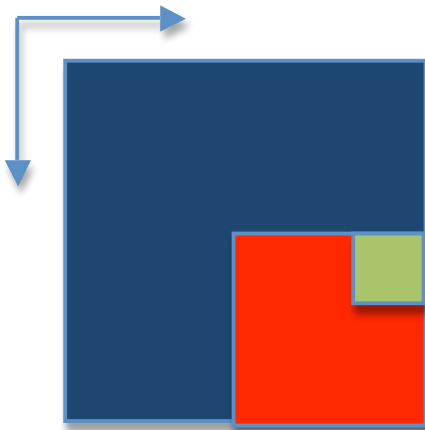

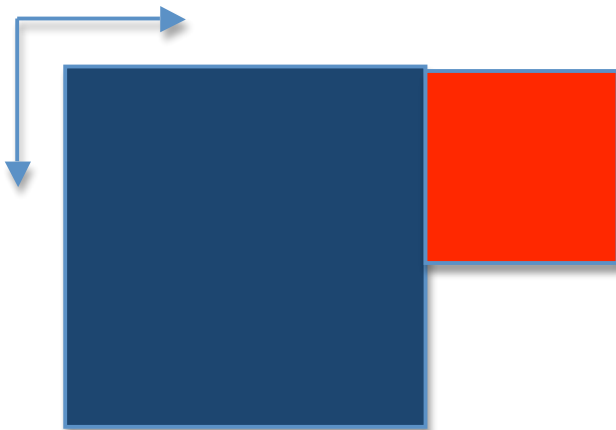

```

#blue {  
  position: relative;  
}  
#red {  
  position: absolute;  
  bottom: 0px;  
  right: 0px;  
}  
#green {  
  position: absolute;  
  top: 0px;  
  right: 0px;  
}
```



```
#blue {  
  position: relative;  
}  
#red {  
  position: absolute;  
  top: 0px;  
  right: -100px;  
}
```

note: you can *assume red box has a width of 100px*
